CELL PHONE RULES

Students are more than welcome to have their phones at school as we realize for many they are walking home at the end of the day etc. We have gone over school rules with our students so they are aware. Here is a copy of our cell phone policy while at school.

PREVALENT MEDICAL

If you have a child with prevalent medical issues we will be sending home new paperwork or will be calling home to see if there are any updates. If your child has medication such as an inhaler or epipen please ensure they are not expired and you have filled out the appropriate paperwork so it can be administered at school.

STUDENT DROP OFF AND DISMISSAL

PLEASE MAKE SURE YOUR CHILD's teacher is aware of how your child is being dismissed each day. Simply inform the teacher so there is no confusion if it is Kiss and Ride, parent pick up or bus. This greatly reduces confusion at the end of the day if the homeroom teacher is aware. Please note that last minute changes are sometimes difficult if called in after 3:00 pm since the office is very busy and often classes are outside. We understand that situations arise, but making the arrangements in the morning helps to ensure everyone gets to where they need to be in time.

Thank you for all your patience as we get settled with drop off and pick up procedures. Now that students know where they are going please do not enter the playground in the morning. There are staff to help and

supervise from 8:50 am - 9:05 am and will ensure they get to their proper spot. Please do not drop off students prior to 8:50 am.

At the end of the day **only parents of our primary students** should be on the playground after 3:25 pm. If you have older children please just let them know where you will be waiting or take advantage of kiss and ride. I have attached the kiss and ride procedures for everyone to review.
